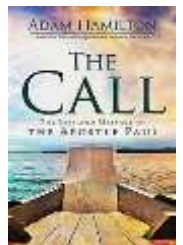

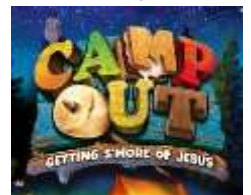


Friend Ministry Recruitment begins May 21

Open Hearts, Open Minds, Open Doors

Between Sundays ~ Thoughts from Pastor Jenny

What does it look like when First United Methodist Church is the church of Jesus Christ? For children, it looks like 1st and 2nd graders praying their way to the cross throughout Lent. For youth it looks like teenage girls painting who they are in Jesus at an IF: Teen Gathering. For adults, it looks like a group of people surrounding one another in prayer or lighting candles representing prayers at a prayer vigil. It also looks like people working in the community garden, reading to children at the school, serving selflessly in the church.



We are people who are recipients of the grace of God through the sacrifice of Jesus Christ on the cross. Our gift of grace should be evident in the ways we act inside and outside the church, as well as how we treat one another. The gift of grace should shine from us as we serve in the community and in the church. Love is a verb, not a noun. To love for Jesus Christ is to love actively, unconditionally and selflessly. When you have more resources, don't keep it all for yourself, share it with those who have less. When someone is experiencing sorrow, don't turn away, instead offer a listening ear and carry their burden for a little while. When someone is being treated unfairly, don't think "that's too bad," instead actually act in a way that leads to justice. When people are experiencing hopelessness, don't keep the Good News to yourself, instead offer the hope that you know comes when you put your trust in Christ.

So what does the First UMC in Tipton look like when it is acting out of the grace that comes from Christ? It looks like each of you doing your part to be the hands and feet of Jesus in the church and in the community. God calls each of us to serve by using the spiritual gifts God has given us. How will you serve? Check out the series on page 5 for THE CALL as a way to discover God's plan for you, and join us in worship in May.

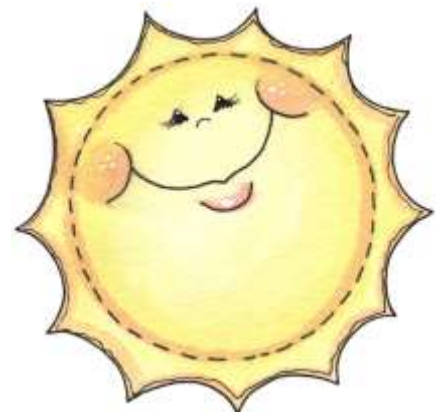

1st UMC Endowment Fund

Once per year the Leadership Council considers proposals for the use of income from the 1st UMC Endowment Fund. Please submit any proposals to the church office by May 1! There are three designated categories from which funds may be requested:

Missions/People projects: local, district, conference, national, international

Maintenance/Trustees: major repairs, major improvements, special objects or furnishings

Ministry/Program Development: education, communication, evangelism, worship...

Guidelines state that income from Endowments may never go toward on-going, budgeted expenses of the church. Furthermore, the founding document states: The existence of this Endowment Fund must in no way reduce the responsible current support and involvement of the church members.

Proposals may come from groups, committees or individuals, though it's preferred they come from a group or committee.
