When I was in high school, I had a tenth grade English teacher who opened up my world to the expression of writing. I had always been a kid who wrote plays for the neighbor kids to act. I even attempted writing a chapter book. (I still have the unfinished manuscript in a box somewhere.) The new awakening as a teen to writing has served me well in preparing sermons and writing papers for seminary. I enjoy writing! As I complete my seminary courses, there will be some writing for the Board of Ordained Ministry, but not as much as I have done in the past six months for seminary.



Thanksgiving Ingathering Kits

Each month we will share what is needed in one of the kits. This month it's the Sewing Kit.

UMCOR Sewing Kits. . .

Foster independence rather than dependence. Cottage industries often grow out of sewing classes where these kits are used to practice skills.

- 3 yards cotton or cotton-blend fabric (one piece)
- 1 new spool matching thread (medium to large size)
- 5-8 matching flat buttons on card
- 1 sewing scissors
- 1 package hand-sewing needles (in original package)

Wrap sewing notions in fabric and seal in a zip lock bag.

Some other kits to consider putting together are; School kits, Health kits, Layette kits.

The 2017 Ingathering brochure is available at the back of the sanctuary and in the office. Here are a few helpful reminders when putting together kits:

Use **ONLY** the list of items provided for the kits.

Use **ONLY** new and unwashed items in kits.

Use **ONLY** items that have **NO** political or religious icons, slogans, emblems or sayings.

Send toothbrushes and soap in **ORIGINAL** wrappers.

Send money for toothpaste separately on remittance form, **NOT** in kit.

You may send empty school bags; they are valued at \$3 each.

Baby sweaters/jackets may be sent and are valued at \$6 each.

Worship Time Change for Fall Beginning September 10

For the past six months there has been a lot of conversation in Creative Worship and among the staff about how we can create more space for groups on Sunday morning and get more time for ministry. We think that we have figured out how to do that with only minimal effect on the current school year schedule.

Here is the proposed Sunday morning schedule:

8:30 am – 12:30 pm Nursery available

8:15 – 8:45 am Choir Kids Practice with Denise Cartwright

8:45 am – 9:45 am Adult GIGs, Adult Classes, Youth Sunday School and Children's Sunday School

New Children's Sunday School will start with an opening worship in the sanctuary for 15-20 min. Then, children will go to the classroom for 40-45 min. The opening worship will be led by Melinda Stonebraker and Denise Cartwright, including music, Bible story teaching, and prayer.

9:45 – 10:00 am Fellowship time in the Gathering Place for all ages.

10:00 – 11:00 am Worship

11:00 – 11:30 am Fellowship in the Gathering Place for all ages.

11:15 am – 12:15 pm New Adult Classes and GIGs meet

Justification for Time Change and Other Details:

1. In order to meet the mission and vision of the church, we need to tweak the schedule a bit. Sunday school is just 15 minutes earlier than it was, and there is only 15 minutes between Sunday school and worship so that people are not waiting too long for the service to start.
2. More time for adult classes with a second time slot after worship.
3. More space for classes by having an after worship time.
4. Fellowship time in the Gathering Place means 2+ groups may meet in the dining room at either time slot and guests have easier access to the fellowship time in the Gathering Place.
5. Will leave the 10:00 am time for worship in the summer instead of changing it.
6. Sunday School teachers are able to be in a GIG or class on Sunday morning with the after worship time
7. 11:15 Nursery time may need to be moved to a larger SS room



Use Your Gifts – Bless Children and Families

We have two great opportunities to bless the lives of children and families. And, of course, we know serving to bless others creates boomerang blessings for those who serve. Please ask God if you're being called to participate in either of these ministries: Friend Ministry and/or Sunday School.

Friend Ministry: Final Call For This Year!

We have had a good response with several adults who want to be part of the Friend Ministry, but we need more because our congregation is blessed with many children! If you've already signed up, great - now, invite a friend or two to sign up also! If you haven't signed up, maybe you don't know what Friend ministry is. It is a new intergenerational ministry to connect adults in our congregation with children and youth. Studies indicate that children and youth who had positive adult influences—in addition to parents—are more likely to be healthy adults. Similar research indicates that the “stickiness” of faith—whether faith sticks from childhood into adulthood—is also influenced by having positive influences from other adults in the church.

Adult Friends will extend the love of Christ and care of the Church by being supportive of their young Friend. This may include greeting them at worship, attending music or sporting events or other extracurricular events, sending birthday cards, making a phone call or sending a text message occasionally to say hello, inquiring to learn more about how they're doing in school, etc. And, of course, praying for your friend. Sunday School Teachers and Helpers Needed

Youth and Adults are needed to serve in children's Sunday School. We will be using a new curriculum and format on Sunday mornings that should make serving in Sunday School a little less time consuming for teachers and more focused on relationship building between teachers and students. If you don't feel you have the knowledge to teach Sunday School, we will help you – and in fact some of it will be done for you in the large group opening each Sunday morning. Grade-level teachers will be responsible for getting to know the students, listening as students grow in faith, and completing simple classroom activities with the guidance of the curriculum. Training is provided and support will be given each week. Each classroom needs three people who will work together to lead. Concerned about missing your adult group time? Adult groups will also be offered after worship on Sundays as well (see page 4 for more information), so teachers can be in an adult group on Sunday as well. 


