# Between Sundays

---

It was Heraclitus, the pre-Socratic Greek philosopher, who said that “Change is the only constant in life” to highlight the need for all of us to always plan for and be ready for change in every aspect of our lives.

The church is not exempt from that notion of change. In fact, the church is constantly changing, whether it is obvious or subtle. All we have to do is look back through history to see the changes that have occurred. For example, we have numerous denominations in Christianity because of changes in thoughts and beliefs. Although Methodism is a relatively new denomination (under 300 years old), we have gone through many changes in our short history.

Although Tipton First is in a state of change right now with Kelley and I arriving in July as your new pastor family, there is a bigger change coming on the horizon. It will come in 2019 as the United Methodist Church prepares for the special General Conference called to consider the question of the denominational response on the question of human sexuality.

Since the paragraphs were added to the *Book of Discipline of the United Methodist Church* (our laws, plan, polity, and process by which we are governed) in 1972, the issue of human sexuality and the church has been hotly debated on all sides and at all levels, from the Council of Bishops to the smallest of churches in some of the remotest places in this world.

Two significant events happened around the last General Conference in 2016 held in Portland, OR. First, the General Conference established the Commission on the Way Forward to study and make recommendations to the Council of Bishops and the church. The Commission has met over the last two years and submitted their report to the Council of Bishops. Although there has been some back and forth with the Judicial Council concerning proceedings for the General Conference, the main purpose of the Special General Conference in 2019 is to hear and act upon the report of the Commission on the Way Forward.

The second significant event was the consecration of the denomination’s first openly gay Bishop, Karen Oliveto, who is now serving as the Bishop in the

Mountain Sky Annual Conference (Colorado, Wyoming, and parts of Utah and Idaho). There were challenges to her consecration, but the Judicial Council will not rule on those challenges until after the Special General Conference.

If you have not been following this issue in our denomination, it is very involved. The Commission’s report is just under 100 pages. Below is a summary, taken from Iowa Conference of the UMC webpage, outlining the three plans:

## Commission on a Way Forward Three Plans

The Council of Bishops considered three plans developed by the [Commission on a Way Forward](#). The Council of Bishops has [indicated its majority recommendation](#) for the One Church Plan, which could allow for different approaches in different places. Their report to the special called 2019 General Conference will also include information about the other two plans.

1. **One Church Plan (recommended):** The one-church model would allow different United Methodists in different places to make different decisions regarding ministry with or by LGBTQ persons rather than maintaining a single standard that operates everywhere throughout the worldwide church. This plan would remove restrictive language from the Book of Discipline and give conferences, churches and pastors the flexibility to “uniquely reach their missional context in relation to human sexuality without changing the connectional nature of The United Methodist Church.”

United Methodists in central conferences in Africa, Asia and Europe would retain the authority to adapt the Book of Discipline and could continue to include their traditional language and values.

This plan would also protect the rights of United Methodists whose theological convictions will not allow them to perform same-sex weddings or ordain LGBTQ people.

2. **Traditionalist Plan:** This plan would affirm the current language about homosexuality in the Book of Discipline and seek to strengthen enforcement for violations of church law.

**3.Connectional-Conference Plan:** This plan would create three connectional conferences based on theology or perspective, each having clearly defined values (accountability, contextualization and justice). The three connectional conferences would function throughout the worldwide church and the five existing U.S. jurisdictions would be abolished.

Adaptations to the Book of Discipline would be allowed by each connectional conference. Annual conferences would determine their affiliation with a connectional conference. Local churches who choose a branch other than the one chosen by their annual conference could vote to join another conference. This plan would require multiple amendments to the denomination's constitution.

The final report of the Commission on a Way Forward has been released in all four official languages of the General Conference: English, French, Portuguese and Swahili. The report will be presented to the 2019 Special Session of General Conference.

Our Bishop, Laurie Haller, and our General Conference delegates will be present at gatherings to worship, answer questions, and be in dialogue together around the pros and cons of each plan. This report will be received by the gathered delegates in St. Louis, Missouri, on February 23–26, 2019. The Bishop also encourages us to take the time to read the entire Commission on a Way Forward report because there is much to take in. I do have a copy of the report and welcome the opportunity to talk about this vital issue with you in the weeks and months ahead.
