It is very appropriate that the pastor's column is called "Between Sundays." A lot goes on in the life of a local congregation and the church "Between Sundays." We speak those words when we take our membership vows as United Methodists. Sometimes we may forget a couple of them and possibly ignore one or two more. As we look forward to starting anew this September (once the public schools are back in session), we are looking forward to seeing all of you who have been gone for the summer to return to "First Church" Tipton. The "official" kick-off for Sunday School for all ages is Sunday, September 9th.

It is also when Kelley and I are looking forward to meeting those of you who have not been able to make one of the various meet-and-greet sessions we have attended over the summer. We plan to carry them on into the fall in hopes of getting to meet the other 400 (give or take) of you who we have not had the pleasure of meeting.

For those who were enrolled in confirmation last year and didn't complete it, get ready. We are going to hold a meeting to outline resuming (or starting out fresh) with confirmation classes. This will be for old and new confirmands and their parents. Watch for the date and time in your email, mailbox, and in the church bulletin.

We all enjoy coming to church otherwise we would not show up at all. Each of us has our reasons for coming to church. They may be varied, but they also have to do with worshipping our God, Father, Son, and Spirit. Yet, just as it "takes a community to raise a child," it takes "the church" to do church. It takes "the church" – the people – to do church. From singing in the choir or the Xn Chaos band, to working the video system, to playing the organ or piano, to greeting people at the door or ushering them to their seats, to being the liturgist or acolytes, to teaching a class or caring for the young ones during worship, it takes "the church" so we can do church.

Finally, I have been asked about leading, teaching, or suggesting studies for our Growth and Impact Groups. There are a few studies I would like to see us do as a group. I will also be looking at teaching a study or two beginning in the fall. Watch for further announcements in our newsletter, bulletin, or on Facebook. If you feel the need to just do it NOW, call Greg in the office and have him add your name to his list of volunteers.

This is an exciting time for us, church. Let the excitement grow!


