Open Hearts, Open Minds, Open Doors

Between Sundays

When we talk about the month of November, a few things come to mind. November is actually a very busy month that begins the "mad dash" to the New Year. Yet, it is also a time of reflection, introspection, contemplation, and thanks.

Halloween will be just ending. All Hallows Eve is the actual name of Halloween. It is the evening before we celebrate All Saints Day (or Sunday), a time to remember the saints, with the New Testament meaning of all Christian people of every time and place. We celebrate the communion of the saints as we remember the dead, both of the Church universal and our local congregation. We will be reading the names of seven from among us who have crossed over into eternity to join the company of saints this year. Let us all remember the saints of our lives with this prayer:

We bless your holy name, O God, for all your servants who, have finished their course, now rest from their labors.

Give us grace to follow the example of their steadfastness and faithfulness,

To your honor and glory;

Through Christ Jesus our Lord. Amen.

We have been talking the last few weeks about our Annual Church (Charge) Conference, which will be November 11, 2018, immediately after worship in the dining area of our church. This year our District Superintendent, Kiboko Kiboko, will not only be preaching during worship but also leading our Church Conference.

Did you notice that I called it the All Church Conference? Many of you may refer to it as the Charge Conference, like I do on occasion, but there is an important difference. If we hold a Charge Conference, only the officers of the Charge (or church), may attend and vote on matters before the Charge. When we hold an All Church Conference, all the members of the church may vote on matters before the church. The only difference between the two is the title of the meeting and who can attend. All the content is the same. So everyone has a voice and vote when we typically hold Church Conferences (although we call them Charge Conferences).

I hope to see many of you after worship that day, participating in the life of the church and this important meeting.

November also brings to mind Thanksgiving. It is a harvest festival, giving thanks for all God's blessings, often characterized by prayer and feasts (and now football). It was first celebrated in North America in 1619 in Charles City, Virginia. Now, Thanksgiving Day in the U.S.A. (it is celebrated in Canada as well) is celebrated on the fourth Thursday in November.

Yet, Thanksgiving may also be a time to remember when the Native American tribal peoples made survival possible for the early immigrants to the U.S.A. Native Americans have a variety of ceremonies for thanksgiving which are related to the seasons of nature, for families to feast and pray, and to offer thanks to the Creator. Many United Methodist congregation hold join services with representatives from Native American congregations or councils in their region.

We will be gathering as an ecumenical worshiping community (UCC, UMC, Lutheran, Four Square), at Peace UCC in Bennett (414 Maple Street), at 6 p.m. on Sunday, November 18, for a service of Thanksgiving. There will be a combined choir and Pastor Steve will be preaching. Refreshments will be served following.

No matter which way you sign up, you will get an 8x10 photograph of your choice absolutely free. You will also get a free directory once they

are produced. You may also buy photographs if you wish, with no pressure to buy additional. (Although they make great Christmas gifts or cards).

So, sign up soon. 47 of you have already done put your names on the list. Spaces are filling up fast. Let's see your smiling face in our new directory. Hopefully they will be here just after the new year. Reserving your photo sitting time NOW!

Network Infrastructure Upgrades

Over the summer the church upgraded our network infrastructure. Initially the project began with the intent of replacing the phones in the church, but as many renovations do, it expanded to include many other items.

As can be seen in the picture, it was time to replace all the 'ad hoc' wiring that had been installed over the years (I'm guilty of some of it!) This rat's nest of phone wiring was discovered behind a wall plate in the church office – unfortunately, it's not the only place I discovered something like this! It was decided, rather than to just purchase new phones, to switch to a hybrid Voice Over IP (VOIP) system. Internally the phone system is VOIP based, but interfaces to the normal analog phone lines for outgoing voice calls. To support this, new networking cable, switches and other gear was required. Since we were upgrading the network gear, it also seemed like a reasonable time to replace the server hardware



(running constantly since October of 2011), along with the wireless system as well.

Over the summer, I installed nearly 1800 feet of new twisted pair network cable, 2 new 1GB switches (previously the network ran at 100MB), a brand new server, a VOIP PBX phone system including 4 office phones, and 2 new cordless phones (in the kitchen and Gathering Place). The Discipleship office, and Little Friends Preschool now have phones connected to the system along with a PC. Eventually voice mail, and an Interactive Voice Response system (for after hours) will be enabled on the system.

Lastly, the wireless system was upgraded to increase reliability and security for WiFi access. The guest wireless system (FUMC-Guest) should now be available in every part of both the old building and the education wing. It is also completely separate from the churches Local Area Network.

Please let me know (<u>bheil@ezrasoft.com</u>) if you experience issues using either the new phones, or the guest wireless network.



Advent Study Coming This December


(and the last Thursday in November, too)
