Open Hearts, Open Minds, Open Doors

This is a story about a guy I will call John. Life seemed to be going great for John. He landed his dream job. He enjoyed the work and the pay and benefits made it all the better. His wife landed a position with the company as well. The double income just added to their enjoyment. They were able to afford a new house in a nice neighborhood on the edge of town. Their three kids went to one of the better schools in the district. Like the LG commercial, life is good for John and his family.

Life was so good, John and his wife decided they could buy some new things. A new this and a new that. They added another vehicle, a motorhome. Not the large, "land yacht" Class A type, but one of those Class C mini motorhomes built on a Dodge chassis. It was the "in-thing" to do. It seemed everyone was switching over to them instead of pulling a trailer. Life is good.

One day, John's wife came home all excited. The company offered her a management position in her department. The problem was it was a couple hours away. John and his wife sat down and thought about all the issues that faced them. The promotion came with a modest salary increase and the company would pay relocation expenses including per diem. Since John did not work in the same department as his wife, he could transfer to the same area and the couple would not have to worry about one supervising the other. Life is good.

John's wife took the position. John watched after the kids and went to his job as usual. Then things started changing. The bills began to mount up. Money didn't seem to be going as far as it used to go. It was getting difficult to make ends meet. John was wondering how they were going to make it. His daddy taught him the importance of meeting his obligations. John and his wife began borrowing to help make ends meet. They thought with the ability to work overtime the bills would be covered. The overtime was sporadic. The extra pay not enough. They realized a lifestyle change was needed.

If we look at the story of John and his family in a broad sense, we can see Tipton First United Methodist Church. In the past, the church was thriving. Attendance was up. The giving was such that the bills were getting paid. Programs were added. The budget grew to meet the needs of the growing congregation. Life is good.

However, things changed. Families have come and gone. Old ones leave and new fill the spaces. For various reasons the income wasn't going as far as it had in the past. The bills seemed to be mounting up. How are we going to pay them? The church is by far not broke. We are not on the verge of filing bankruptcy or anything like that. There is this "stash" of money just sitting in the corner we can use. Something called designated accounts. That will help us get by for now. We can pay it back later.

That later is now up to \$27,300 (on paper). I use the term "on paper" because that is what is needed to make those designated accounts whole again, to repay what has been borrowed.

A designated account is one where a person has designated a specific place for their giving to be spent. For example, the parsonage remodeling fund is a designated account. The money can only be used for that purpose. It does not go in the general fund, which is where the bills get paid.

If for some reason we had to pay out all the designated funds, we would not be able to do so. We would be in the red \$27,300. That is not the way to be good stewards of the money entrusted to us. We were doing well trying to pay the balance down until June. Then the donations to the General Fund dropped by 50%. Giving to designated funds and the lack of income in general due to a drop in attendance is where the problem lies.

How do we fix this? I have two suggestions. First, if you are like me and give to a designated fund, how about just giving to the general fund for a while? That will help us out immensely. Also, to ensure we receive your giving, tithes and pledges on a regular basis, how about signing up for electronic giving? You can specify what date you want your donation to the church to come out of your account(s) and the amount. That way you don't have to worry about writing a check. Your bank will have a record of it for you.

To sign up for electronic giving, just give Greg a call in the office or stop by and see him. It only takes a couple minutes and your giving will be automatic. Think about it, pray about it. If you have questions, let's talk about it.

Finally, we are working on some ideas on how to reduce the deficit and restore wholeness so we can again continue doing the ministry we have always done. It is too early to talk about it right now, but we will keep you informed. We might be able to rid ourselves of this issue by the end of the year. Pray for clarity. One last thing on this issue. The story of John, that was me in my younger days. Lessons were definitely learned! Now, let's switch gears for a moment. The first Sunday in October is World Communion Sunday, a day when Christians all over the world celebrate communion together. Last year we were joined by the folks from Trinity Lutheran Church across the street. This year, we are going to join them. We will still have Sunday School and GIGS meet here, but at the break, we will go over to Trinity Lutheran. Pastor Beth will lead the service, I will preach, and she and I will celebrate communion with the gathered communities. Please join us as we re-member and celebrate the Table of the Lord together.

Thanksgiving Ingathering Kits

Last month we mistakenly put the wrong list in for the school kit. We apologize for that and hope that no one put together a kit with the wrong supplies.

There is still time to put together kits. Listed below are the correct lists of supplies for each kit. We will be collecting kits until October 26. On November 2 the kits will be delivered to our Ingathering site in Mount Pleasant.

Student School Kit

- 3 Notebooks 1 subject spiral 8"x10.5"
- 1 pair of student round tip scissors
- 1 ruler 12" long with metric
- 1 box of 24 crayons

Place items in zip-lock bag.

Layette Kit

- 6 cloth diapers
- 2 gowns or sleepers
- 2 diaper pins must have protective plastic closures
- 2 receiving blankets 28"x28" to 32"x32" (no crib blankets)
- 1 sweater, sweatshirt or jacket must open from the front, may be hand-knitted, crocheted or sewn
- 2 undershirts or onesies
- 2 infant size washcloths (no adult washcloths)

Bundle items inside one of the blankets and secure with diaper pins.

Hygiene Kit

- 1 new hand towel 15"x25" up to 17"x27"
- 1 new washcloth
- 1 large, sturdy comb (at least 6" of teeth")
- 1 toenail or fingernail clipper no emery boards or metal nail files
- 1 bath-size bar of soap in wrapper (3 oz bar or larger) No Ivory or Jergens
- 1 new adult size toothbrush in original sealed wrapper
- 10 adhesive bandages (3/4" by 3") common household bandages acceptable
- 1 one gallon size re-sealable bag

Lay out hand towel and lay washcloth flat in center. Place rest of items on top of washcloth. Fold sides of towel to cover items. Grasp the bundle tightly and roll over the remainder of the towel tightly. Place the tightly rolled bundle in plastic bag, remove air and seal.

COMING IN JANUARY MAKING DISCIPLES CONFIRMATION CLASS

Confirmation class will start in January. We will be using the Making Disciples Curriculum by William Willimon (retired UMC Bishop). *Making Disciples* is a 13-session mentor-based confirmation program that pairs confirmands with adult



mentors and guides them through a variety of learning experiences that will strengthen the student's understanding of the faith while connecting him or her with the community of believers in a personal way.

WE ARE LOOKING FOR ADULT MENTORS TO GUIDE OUR STUDENTS THROUGH THIS PROGRAM.

This is a confirmation program that is more like a process and less like a reading assignment, more engaging and congruent with the nature of the Christian faith than existing programs.

Topics explore the basics of Christian faith: God, Jesus, Holy Spirit, worship, the Bible, gifts, ministry, Baptism, spiritual life, death and resurrection, and the church.

If you are an adult interested in helping to shape and mold those who will lead our church in the future by becoming a mentor for this 13-week class, please see Pastor Steve. We will have training in December or early January. The training will be about two hours.

We have created this Sunday Servant schedule to run through December. Please check this schedule and mark your calendar. If your name is not on here, you may have missed the Sundays when we did sign ups. We would be ecstatic to have more people sign up. We often need last minute substitutes. If you immediately or eventually see a conflict, please try to trade with someone else on the list. If you need a phone number or email address, please look in the church pictorial directory or contact the church office, <u>office@tiptonumc.org</u>

USHERS – We have a detailed outline of instructions on the back table in the sanctuary. Please arrive 25 minutes early to check instructions and usher. There are a couple recent changes:

- 1. Make sure there are 4 offering plates on the altar. For the general offering, all 4 ushers go down the center aisle to pick up plates from the minister. The two on the outside go left or right, the other two up the middle starting at the FRONT. Copper Kettle Offering: Three ushers will go forward, one down the middle and two on the outside aisles moving toward the back. When all is collected two ushers bring the plates and the Copper Kettle offering forward and place them on the altar. On Communion Sunday the plates should be placed on the pedestals on each side of the sanctuary for people to place their offering in them as they pass by.
- 2. Acolytes light the candles after the Pastor has gone forward and the Prelude has been played. They light candles at the beginning of the first hymn. When the acolytes return they should ring the church bell SEVEN times.

GREETERS – Please arrive 30–45 minutes early. Your name tags will be on the radiator in the entry. Please be aware of newcomers. If they have children make them aware of the nursery, activity bags, restrooms, changing tables etc. Make sure the ushers are aware they are newcomers too. More detailed instructions are on the table in back of the sanctuary.

LITURGIST – You will receive a copy of the scripture for the service by email. There will also be a copy of the scripture on the lectern you may use. Feel free to sit in the chair behind the lectern or with the congregation.

NURSERY – Please be available at least 15 minutes before the service. If no children arrive, please be aware that children may want to go to the nursery after the children's sermon.

POWER POINT – If you have been assigned to help run the slides for the PowerPoint, please arrive in the balcony several minutes before the service begins. If you have questions or want some training contact Brian Heil, <u>bheil@ezrasoft.com</u>
