




Join us for Worship in 2018: The Cycle of Grace Series

January will begin the 9th year! The meals will continue to be served from 11:00 a.m. to Noon on the second, fourth, and fifth Saturdays each month.

We have several community groups who help regularly with Shared Blessings meals. When community groups serve the meals, we need one person from our church to serve as a "coordinator" or "host" for the meal. The "coordinator" or "host" helps groups navigate the kitchen, answers questions and gives guidance for meal preparation and clean-up. If that task sounds overwhelming, ask a friend to do it with you. (Those who are experienced will also be happy to provide training.)

The sign-up sheets for 2018 are located in the Gathering Place. Please consider volunteering – it's a great way to meet new friends or invite a group of friends, committee/SS class/Circle/GIG or another small group sign up for a meal or two.

Many volunteer opportunities are available. If you are interested in helping cook or with meal preparation, we do some food prep ahead of time and the rest during the early (9:00-11:00) shift. If you are interested in serving, cleanup, and interacting with those who come to Shared Blessings, sign up for the late (11:00-1:00) shift. We also need people to deliver meals to "homebound" folks, and provide "hospitality or friendship" by simply eating and talking with our guests. Our church leadership values intergenerational relationships and whole church learning as well as opportunities for variety in worship experiences. We have combined these two ideals into one big celebration with intentionally intergenerational worship, learning, and fellowship each quarter on the 5th Sunday of the month. 5th Sunday includes all of us together in Sunday School for learning and service, something creative and different during worship, and potluck lunch together. We get an extra Sunday each quarter – so let's make it count.


Because 5th Sunday fell during Christmas Break, so we have moved our 5th Sunday celebration to the first Sunday in January. It will be a great way to start off 2018! Mark your calendars to attend and invite someone to come with you. The theme for this 5th Sunday January 7 will be Epiphany (it will be Epiphany Sunday after all!). What does epiphany mean? It means seeing God. We will celebrate the ways we "see God".

During the Sunday School hour, families, singles, youth, children, adults – everyone – will hear together about two epiphanies from scripture in the stories of Anna and Simeon seeing baby Jesus in Luke 2. We will share about how we see God today and what we do when we see God. Our service project together during Sunday School will be to give thanks. We will have lots of Thank You cards available and pens, crayons, markers, and colored pencils so all of us – from the smallest to the tallest – can all say thank you to the people we see God through.

During the worship hour, we will continue to celebrate the ways we see God in our lives. There will not be a sermon, instead we will hear how our sisters and brothers have seen God through brief and inspiring personal testimonies. We will hear the story of the Wise Men seeing God in Matthew. And, we will consider how we look for God, how we see God, and how we respond to God.
