



Open Hearts, Open Minds, Open Doors

Between Sundays

In the most recent lesson in our Lenten study, *The Walk*, we discussed where do we see God in our lives? Where do we feel close to God through the arts, nature, and in general revelation? I know there are many of us who listen to and receive inspiration from Christian radio. One of the reasons why so many people like to sing the more contemporary songs in worship is they feel a special connection with God through the music.

I am writing this column on March 16, the Monday after we suspended all activities at the church due to the COVID-19 virus. The situation around the virus outbreak seems to be changing daily, if not hourly. I have watched as not only our Bishop, but Bishop's in other Annual Conferences across this nation, struggle to make decisions that seem best for those United Methodist churches under their care.

We, too, have struggled here in Iowa...in Tipton. What seemed to be a last-minute decision to suspend worship on March 15 was distressing. However, the decision was made when the reality hit that it only takes one to infect hundreds as is evident in New Rochelle, N.Y.

Yet I am also comforted by words we find in scripture. I am comforted by the words we find set to music. I think of the Newsboys, when we hear:

In this time of desperation
When all we know is doubt and fear
There is only one foundation
We believe, we believe
In this broken generation
When all is dark, You help us see
There is only one salvation
We believe, we believe

There are hundreds of songs born of scripture we can pull from for inspiration in times like this. The chaos that God calmed when the world was called into order seems to rise up every now and then to bring fear, anxiety, panic in some, and a host of other emotions. It is in times like this that we need to turn to scripture and remember the words of Jesus when he said not to worry. We need to focus our attention on our present, our here and now, and not worry. Each day has enough of that.

Instead, we need to remember that we can talk with God and the best way to do that is through prayer. Pray for others, pray for ourselves, pray for those afflicted with this virus, and pray for those trying to help stop the spread of the disease. If you don't know what to say, just talk to God. If you still are uncertain what to do, pray the Lord's Prayer. Remember, we are told in Romans 8:26, "Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes^[a] with sighs too deep for words."

My friends, we are all in this together around the world, for we are one human family. Our call for such a time as this is to practice the words of the apostle Paul in Galatians 6:2, "Bear one another's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ." This is a time to care for each other, to reach out to those who may be shut-in, and be the heart and hands of Christ to all who need our help.

So, as we pray, let us also try to go about our lives in the new normal that is temporarily before us. Yes, some of us will need to stay at home, limiting contact with others, now called social distancing.

Yes, we cannot gather for worship, but we are putting our modified worship services on our web page. Hopefully, shortly after this newsletter is sent out, we will hear we can go back to worship as usual on Sunday mornings. However, if that is not possible for the foreseeable future, we will strive to bring meaningful worship to you the best we can.

Our committees and our classes will be meeting on the internet/telephone so we can still do business for those who do not wish to meet in person.

Which brings up another matter. We are called to help support our church through our prayers, our presence, our gifts, our service, and our witness. In our worship services one of the ways we present our gifts to God is through the offering plate. Unfortunately, we cannot pass the plate through the virtual world.

So, I am asking you to remember to give as you have been called to give, but maybe not in the way you are accustomed to giving. Instead of dropping your tithes and offerings in a basket, drop it in an envelope addressed to our church and put it in the mail. Drop by the office and say "Hi" to Greg as you hand him your offering envelope, and chat a while. If you wish, give electronically. Greg can help you get that established so your gift to God comes out of your checking or savings account on a regular basis.

Let's remember, giving is also an act of worship!

Finally, we don't know how long the COVID-19 virus will be with us or how it will affect our community. If this is a protracted situation, we will adjust as necessary. In the meantime, we will try to keep everyone up-to-date as much as possible on church related activities through the internet, our newsletter, our Facebook page, and by talking to those who are not connected through technology.

Mobile Pantry Distribution Changes

Tipton First UMC has received instructions concerning the HACAP Food Reservoir's new food distribution procedures in light of the COVID-19 virus. It reads in part:

For the foreseeable future, we are making changes to our mobile pantry distribution to protect your health and the health of the clients.

- We will be distributing pre-boxed food rather than setting up tables for clients to "shop" from. Bob will have pallets of boxes and bags ready to add the perishable items like produce, bakery and meat to. We will distribute directly from the truck, to reduce contact with clients. They will not be able to select what they want. This will strictly be a bag and go hand off.
- Clients will be asked to wait in their vehicles and just drive thru for pick up. If clients do not have cars, we are asking that you help to keep them from forming a line and spreading out as much as possible. Calling one person at a time up to receive their pre-boxed and bagged items.
- Check in should be done by one person, if they are new and need to sign a TEFAP form, please keep contact minimal. Gloves are available from Bob to wear.

We know these changes are not how we would like to distribute food to our neighbors, but for now these measures allow us to keep getting them food while protecting everyone's health.

For now, out of an abundance of caution, when you arrive for a volunteer shift you will be asked to sign a waiver that you have not traveled to a high-risk area and are not experiencing any signs of illness.

Thank you for your continued commitment to serving our community with dignity and respect. We'll continue to monitor and adjust strategies to keep us all safe and healthy moving forward.



Recorded Worship Service During Pandemic Isolation

The church is currently posting recorded video of weekly worship on Sundays at 10:00 am. You can find these videos at the church's website (www.tiptonumc.org) on the Worship page. This page can be accessed via the menus (click on Worship, or the Livestream item under the Worship menu). It is also available by clicking on the Latest Worship Video link in the Worship Times area under the logo, and also by clicking on the Worship Live button on the home page. Note that these videos are recorded on the Wednesday prior to the Sunday when they are available on the web.

When we return to our regular 'in-person' services, we will be streaming the service live for those unable to make it to the church for worship. We are still working on licensing and restrictions on what can and cannot be streamed, so there may be portions of the service that are unavailable on the web. Live service video will be available in the same place on the website as the recorded videos.

Please note that going forward you will need to always use a microphone during announcements and Joys and Concerns so that you can be heard on the video stream. One thing that will make this easier is if we have designated 'mic runners' to make sure the microphones (one on the main level, and one in the balcony) are easy to use. If anyone is interested in this duty (or interested in offering up your middle-school or older children for this duty!) please contact me (bheil@ezrasoft.com) or the office (office@tiptonumc.org). The main floor microphone is usually taken care of by the Chaos singers (every 2nd and 4th Sunday) but we'll need volunteers for the balcony and main levels on other Sundays.

USHERS – We have a detailed outline of instructions on the back table

in the sanctuary. Please arrive 25 minutes early to check instructions and usher. There are a couple recent changes:

- 1. Make sure there are 4 offering plates on the altar. For the general offering, all 4 ushers go down the center aisle to pick up plates from the minister. The two on the outside go left or right, the other two up the middle starting at the FRONT. Copper Kettle Offeing: Three ushers will go forward, one down the middle and two on the outside aisles moving toward the back. When all is collected two ushers bring the plates and the Copper Kettle offering forward and place them on the altar. On Communion Sunday the plates should be placed on the pedestals on each side of the sanctuary for people to place their offering in them as they pass by.
- 2. Acolytes light the candles after the Pastor has gone forward and the Prelude has been played. They light candles at the beginning of the first hymn. When the acolytes return they should ring the church bell SEVEN times.

GREETERS – Please arrive 30-45 minutes early. Your name tags will be on the radiator in the entry. Please be aware of newcomers. If they have children make them aware of the nursery, activity bags, restrooms, changing tables etc. Make sure the ushers are aware they are newcomers too. More detailed instructions are on the table in back of the sanctuary.

LITURGIST – You will receive a copy of the scripture for the service by email. There will also be a copy of the scripture on the lectern you may use. Feel free to sit in the chair behind the lectern or with the

congregation.

NURSERY – Please be available at least 15 minutes before the service

If no children arrive, please be aware that children may want to go to the nursery after the children's sermon.

POWER POINT – If you have been assigned to help run the slides for

the PowerPoint, please arrive in the balcony several minutes before the service begins. If you have questions or want some training contact Brian Heil, <u>bheil@ezrasoft.com</u>




