United Methodists believe in an open table; anyone may receive communion.


Our Book of Worships says, "All who intend to lead a Christian life, together with their children, are invited to receive the bread and cup."

It's the same grace that Brennan Manning devoted his life to sharing: profound in nature and coming from a God who loves us just as we are, and not as we should be.

A list of each kit and what is needed will be available at the back of the sanctuary as well as in the breezeway. Please fill the kits with just what is on the list. They are very particular.

Layette Kit

- 6 Cloth Diapers
- 2 Gowns or Sleepers
- 2 Onesies or Undershirts
- 2 Infant Washcloths No adult washcloths
- 6 Diaper Pins must have protective plastic closures
- 1 Sweater, Sweatshirt, or Jacket (0–6 months) knitted, crocheted or sewn with front opening No ties or buttons
- 2 Receiving Blankets 28"x28" to 32"x32" No crib, fleece or thermal blankets

Bundle items inside one of the blankets and secure with diaper pins. Add a \$2 donation for diaper cream.

Landscaping Update

You may have noticed some change in the landscaping in front of the education wing. The mulch that we put down in June 2019 is disintegrating quickly. I removed the bark from that area and put it in a few areas in the long stretch of landscaping that leads to the education wing. Bob was planning to use river rock but the quarry does not have any right now! What we



used is river rock from the Moscow quarry and much of it is quite small. We put on 2 tons of rock but it needs more. So our thought is to hopefully put a layer of river rock from the quarry next spring.

This will be an ongoing project doing a small section at a time. We are laying down landscape cloth under the rock. Jan and Ruehl Wehde are expert gardeners and have been taking care of the north and east side of the church. We are all hoping this change will result in minimal care going forward.
