# What is Lent and why does it last forty days?

Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday

and ends on Holy Saturday. Lent comes from the Anglo Saxo word *lencten*, meaning "lengthen" and refers to the lengthening days of spring. The forty days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin his ministry.

Lent is a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a time of self-examination and reflection. In the early church, Lent began as a period of fasting and preparation for baptism by new converts and then became a time of penance by all Christians. Today, Christians focus on relationship with God, growing as disciples and extending ourselves, often choosing to give up something or to volunteer and give of ourselves for others.

Sundays in Lent are not counted in the forty days because each Sunday represents a "mini-Easter." This is why you will see the designation "Sunday in Lent" rather than "Sunday of Lent" in the naming of these Sundays. On each Lord's Day in Lent, while Lenten fasts continue, the reverent spirit of Lent is tempered with joyful anticipation of the Resurrection.

#### From Pastor Jay's Perspective

Dear Friends.

On Sunday, after worship, and then Monday I heard from several people that they were appreciative of my sermon on forgiveness. I think that the skit that I shared did a powerful job of showing what can happen when we fail to forgive. When we hear the word forgiveness we tend to pay attention, because, well, forgiveness is hard.

Well, if forgiveness is so hard, why do we bother? We do it because by offering forgiveness we offer resurrection. Bishop Laurie Haller in her most recent post shared this,

"The one thing I've heard over and over from people in the churches I've served is that forgiveness is a process, and it's hard work. But when we forgive, we practice resurrection. We not only offer resurrection and new life to others, but by forgiving, we experience resurrection ourselves. You and I practice resurrection by reaching out to people who are yearning to know Christ's love."

One of the things that Lent is about is resurrection. Jesus' resurrection of course, but as the Bishop stated, ours as well. Resurrection is about being freed. Jesus was freed from death, and when we forgive we are freed to live a life more in harmony with God.

So this Lent let us seek out those who need our forgiveness, and in so doing may we free them to more fully love God, may we free ourselves to do the same, and may we free the church to make a bigger difference in the world. Forgiveness is hard, but surely the end result is worth it. May this Lenten season bring blessing to all.

May it be so. Amen.
