ARE YOU A "MEMBER" OF 1st UMC?? Paul Frederiksen, Interim Pastor

If you are a "member" of this or any United Methodist Church, at one time you pledged to participate by your "prayers, presence, gifts, service and witness." That's not a buffet; it's the solid diet of a growing Christian. After all, the 'business' of a church is to assist Christians to grow.

It is the duty of the leadership of a church, lay and clergy, to hold people accountable for their participation and, therefore, their growth.

What that, briefly, means for the leadership of this church:

- 1. There's no such thing as being a "member" and requesting to hear nothing from us! When you make a request to receive no mail, not even the newsletter, you are, in effect, saying you no longer consider yourself a member. It is our duty to oblige and remove your name.
- 2. If you disagree with that assessment you have until October 12th to contact the current pastor; or Lay Leader Lois Salmonson; or the church office, setting up an appointment with one of the persons listed above.
- 3. We have a considerable number of "members" for whom we have no current contact information. On that account, and after attempting to locate people, we must assume we are no longer their church.

Those names will be presented to the Leadership Council for comment. If no one expresses a reason for them to remain a member, those names will be read at the October 16 Church Conference.

- 4. Then, the next year, genuine attempts will be made by the church leadership to make a connection with each of those people. If that effort is unsuccessful the name/s will be read at the 2023 Church Conference and, once again, if no one expresses a reason that person should remain a "member," the person will be removed from active membership.
- 5. Please note that such action takes into consideration one's stage of life. College students and others in the early stage of "adulthood" may not have an established place of residence nor a connection and participation in a different church.
- 6. Persons in late life who may not be able to get out; or who have moved out of necessity to be near family or provision of care will have their circumstance considered.
- Anyone who has a new church home or for any reasons desires to be removed from active membership is asked to make the request in writing to the church office. That request will be honored.
- 8. Persons removed by any means can request to re-affirm their intent to be an active member.

WE NEED CONTACT INFORMATION for persons relating to 1st UMC!! Obviously, we are not able to make connection with anyone with a new residence; and landline that "is no longer in service or has been disconnected;" and for whom we have a non-current email address. Our best chance to re-connect is for FAMILY MEMBERS to PROVIDE contact information. Please provide it in writing!!

My term as Intentional Interim Pastor is scheduled to conclude the end of October. There continues to be some matters we will seek to mend, hem and heal. I've been in touch with Superintendent Moody Colorado and other Conference leaders who may have something to say about how 1st UMC proceeds in November. Whenever any information comes in pertaining to that matter we will make it known. Minimally, the best time to be kept abreast of the church 'news' is to be present Sunday morning!!

Church Conference

Sunday, October 16 at 2:00 p.m.

Everyone is invited to the Church Conference, which is equivalent to the "annual meeting!" This meeting is convened by District Superintendent Rev. Moody Colorado. This meeting is the single biggest opportunity you have to express and show your passion for 1st UMC of Tipton. Leadership is doing all they can to be well-prepared. [Everyone is invited and has participation and voice. However, the guidelines of the UMC are such that only "members" are allowed to vote.]

Two comments:

Fantastic response by everyone to provide input for the "Mission and Ministry Plan 2023"!! We had 20 responses which represents over 30 individuals! Your comments, a copy of which is posted in the Gathering Place on the bulletin board, reveal your understanding, experience – and in some cases – realization that the Church is not a pastor or building but that each and every one of YOU ARE The First United Methodist Church. Yes, each of you is either a strong brick... or a chunk of crumbling mortar.

Secondly, the desire was stated that you'd like a pastor; and that you'd prefer the pastor live in Tipton. The low number of pastors coupled with the over-head costs of full-time pastoral leadership suggest it is unlikely to remain a single-point charge. However, still the best way to give Conference leadership the objective message that you are serious about being in vital ministry is to be fiscally responsible; i.e. pay the bills. For some reason you have reduced your giving to the point that 1st UMC is NOT paying all the bills. It's not because you can't; it's because you've decided, perhaps subconsciously, that you won't.

Okay, the past few years have been a challenge. Pastoral leadership has had horrible life-changing circumstances, poor health has changed intentions, and it happens occasionally that a pastor just doesn't work out for the benefit of the majority of the people. Don't allow the recent past to define your future!! Besides, C.S. Lewis wrote, following the death of his wife (whose name happened to be Joy !):

Hardships often prepare ordinary people for extraordinary destiny.

As I read the Mission and Ministry survey responses, that thought kept returning. God uses 'hardships' to bring about new life and new possibilities. Just think: Easter follows Good Friday; Life comes from death!! God's not done with us . . . so let's not act like it!

"The United Methodist Church and Gender" Sunday, October 2 at 2 pm

You may recall that the 2020 General Conference of the UMC was intending to vote on whether or not to be inclusive on LGBTQI basis. That General Conference was postponed due to our friend Covid. It was postponed again; then cancelled and agenda moved to the regularly scheduled 2024 General Conference.

I will be hosting an opportunity to have conversation about the topic. However, I will begin the Forum by sharing my thoughts on the subject, starting with some Bible Study. A Call to Prayer and Action in Response to Gun Violence

"Thou shall not kill."-Exodus 20:13

We are called as United Methodist Bishops to respond to the devastation and disruption due to gun violence. Communities around the world are traumatized; we are facing a global and national health crisis; and children, families, and communities are left with emotional scars that beg for angels of mercy and the healing balm of Gilead.

The Bible declares in Exodus 20:13 "Thou shall not kill"—yet gun violence continues to escalate. In 2021 and 2022, 43 million more guns were sold in the United States, in addition to the 400 million guns already owned. As of June 2022, the United States has experienced over 300 mass shootings in this year alone.

This is a call to prayer for all who follow Jesus, the Prince of Peace. This is a call to action for all to weep with those who weep and demand, insist on, and push for positive change from our elected officials.

As United Methodists we have made our claim for a more excellent way to live and bring change.

"As followers of Jesus, called to live into the reality of God's dream of shalom as described by Micah, we must address the epidemic of gun violence so 'that he may teach us his ways and the way we may walk in God's paths.' Therefore, we call upon United Methodists to prayerfully address gun violence in their local context." (Book of Resolution #3428 2016)

This call to prayer is not a shallow request but one that firmly believes that the collective prayers of God's people will keep this issue in the forefront of our consciousness and guide our intentional discernment of the action needed to bring about change.

It's great to be in a setting in which I have some historical perspective. For example, Sue the Treasurer and I went over some things and then the next day I was looking for some items in the files. I came across a 10 year-old statement of the Foundation accounts. Wow. Time has passed! Here are the Foundation accounts with current value followed by their value in 2012.

The well written guidelines written in 1992 when a contribution by Carroll Mitchell made it possible to dream of a church endowment fund state:

"The Endowment Fund is created and exists solely for charitable purposes... and for nonrecurring purposes not regularly budgeted." The same 1992 guidelines went on to say:

"Our hope is that others will demonstrate stewardship in the growth of this fund to support the missions, ministries and maintenance of our church."

That was 30 years ago when someone had the vision to make provision for the future of 1st UMC. Since then, a fun – and impossible – activity would be to trace the income received from these endowments and the lives affected.

It is also good to remember that Carroll Mitchell did not wait until the end of his life to be generous with the church – so I've been told! He just provided in his estate what he valued and practiced in life. That is all God expects from anyone, to live generously. One of my mantras is: Don't expect the dead to pay for the ministry of the living. Each of us has resources for which we have faithful responsibility. But as is always the case, responsibility has within it accountability.

Endowment income doesn't and was never intended to remove from you the spiritual benefits of being generous and thinking of others with your financial abilities! In fact stories abound of churches that soon fail or even close after they receive some sort of windfall, whether from an estate that gives funds for "general budget" or even no designation; or from a business deal (like the country church in southern IL whose land, it was discovered, sat on an oil well!); or any other source.

"Don't allow the dead to pay for the ministry of the living!" This is your church. You get to participate to make it what God intends by your "prayers, presence, gifts, service and witness"!
