### **A Word From Pastor Melody**

Hello Church,

I confess, I have an ongoing struggle with the church as a whole. Please know I am not talking about this church, another church in town, or any particular denomination. I am making a general statement about the expression of Christianity as I have found it in the USA.

As Christians, we are to reflect the incredible gift of Christ's love to people who desperately need to know all he has offered. Putting this gift into words is beyond me now, but I can say that so many feel unworthy of what God has to offer—and guess what? We all are! I struggle with the inability of Christ's followers to sit with one another in pain and not tell them what to do, which often furthers the shame and feelings of unworthiness of those facing things we don't talk about.

I am going to give you a few depressing statistics. If you want to avoid reading these statistics, stop here.

- 1 in 4 adults has a diagnosable mental illness—this number is growing, and a counselor friend told me the statistic is closer to 40%
- 1 in 4 women and 1 in 9 men will experience severe intimate partner violence
- Over half of women and almost 1 in 3 men have experienced sexual violence involving physical contact in their lifetime
- Let's add in people who have lost custody of their children, face addiction issues, have strained family relationships, or have family members who are struggling with some of the above....

There are so many situations I could put on this list. But I don't want to belabor the point. The point is people are suffering. The further point is people often do not think they can come to the church with what they are facing. Why? Because sadly, often, the church does not know how to be present with some of these situations and does not want to admit they exist.

I have had far too many conversations with people who have been further harmed in conversations they have had with people in churches where they were seeking help. What has happened is the shame they now feel has sent them fleeing from the church instead of toward it. Many of these people know deep down that they need what the church is here to offer but have not found what they need.

What do we do? How do we respond? How do we listen? I want to talk about all of these things in a workshop. We will speak, hear, practice, and grow in how we can offer Christ's presence to people in some of the most challenging places they find in their lives. I pray that many community members will come to join in this conversation on Oct 15 from 2–5 pm here at the church. Will you join me for "Talking About the Things We Don't Talk About"?


#### Layette Kit


#### First Friday Donut and Devotions!
