A Word From Pastor Melody

Hello Friends,

In November, finding things to be thankful for is talked about. Facebook feeds will begin filling up with posts like something I am grateful for daily.

It is a great practice to look for things we are thankful for. I remember a job I had when I was in college. I had opportunities to train people in this job. One of my supervisors noticed that as I talked to an individual, I told them what they needed to improve on or do differently. When they got an opportunity, they pulled me aside and spoke about a “praise sandwich.” First, you praise the person for something you noticed (something you are thankful for).

At the end of the conversation, you praise them for something else. Somewhere in the middle, you may insert what needs to improve. At that time, I learned that it takes seven positives to combat one negative. This newsletter article is about something other than the proper way to train a new employee. It isn't about relating to people, though that story is probably a good reminder. It is about thankfulness. When we focus on the good, when we take the time to be thankful, it also changes our perspective.

Most of us do not naturally look for things to be thankful for. What does it look like to watch for things we can praise or be thankful for? Our Sunday school classes have been filling out crosses with God-sightings. God-sightings remind us to take time and actively notice how God is at work around us, thus praising God for what he is doing in our midst. They provide opportunities to be thankful and to praise God. These praises often concern what God has done for us or how God has blessed us.

We can all be actively looking for God-sightings.

The Sunday school classes did not start looking for God-sightings when it was the fashionable time to be thankful (November). We hope our Sunday school students will watch throughout the week for how God is at work. What would it look like if that was our practice? What if we actively looked for the great things around us and started verbalizing our thanksgiving and praises to God? What if our prayers became filled with thankfulness and a few requests? What would it do for our hearts and the heart of God if there were seven praises for every comment about how things could improve? Offering praise is something I need to work on myself. Will you join me in a spirit of thankfulness and praise, not just in November but throughout the year?

United Methodist Student Day

Every year, General Board of Higher Education and Ministry awards an average of \$5.5 million in financial aid to United Methodist students. The offering taken on United Methodist Student Day is one opportunity to support these scholarships. Every dollar – **yes 100%** received goes towards supporting and educating a new generation of principled Christian leaders for the church and the world. Supporting this Special Sunday is truly an investment in our future.

Currently, there are over 70 scholarships available for undergraduate, graduate, or doctoral United Methodist students. Financial support for all General Board of Higher Education and Ministry scholarships come from five primary sources: 63% from endowments; 22% from wills and annuities; 13% from United Methodist Special Sundays and 1% from online gifts and fiduciary income. All donations received empower and encourage our students that we are investing in them and our future.

On Sunday, November 26, the Copper Kettle offering will go to United Methodist Student Day. A number of individuals from our congregation have benefited from these scholarships.


The Upper Room Devotionals for November/December are here. You can pick one up at the back of the church, in the Gathering Place, or in the breezeway.
