A Word From Pastor Melody

I confess. I have been trying to get to sleep for the last two hours. God keeps bringing this parable you are about to read to mind. I have not studied this parable lately. It is not one that I have in any upcoming sermon series. But God has it seared into my brain—these ten virgins waiting for the bridegroom. Please read the scripture. Read it with a mind to summarize Jesus' words in your own words.

"Then the kingdom of heaven will be like ten virgins who took their lamps and went to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were foolish, and five were wise. For when the foolish took their lamps, they took no oil with them, but the wise took flasks of oil with their lamps. As the bridegroom was delayed, they all became drowsy and slept. But at midnight there was a cry, 'Here is the bridegroom! Come out to meet him.' Then all those virgins rose and trimmed their lamps. And the foolish said to the wise, 'Give us some of your oil, for our lamps are going out.' But the wise answered, saying, 'Since there will not be enough for us and for you, go rather to the dealers and buy for yourselves.' And while they were going to buy, the bridegroom came, and those who were ready went in with him to the marriage feast, and the door was shut. Afterward the other virgins came also, saying, 'Lord, lord, open to us.' But he answered, 'Truly, I say to you, I do not know you.' Watch therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour." –Matthew 25:1–13 (ESV)

Take time to write your summary. Take time to answer these questions. What did you learn about God? What did you learn about people? What do you feel God is telling you? What are you going to do with it?

The story of the ten virgins is a window into preparation, of being ready for Christ's return—Jesus is the bridegroom. We are reminded to be prepared instead of relying on someone else's readiness. As a pastor, these words bring a level of conviction—asking me how I am preparing those I lead to be people to be ready for the time all of us will one day meet Christ. That time may be when we face earthly death or it may be when Christ returns. But, there is more to it. How are we presenting Christ to the world as we live—how does the light of Christ shine from us? Are our lamps filled with oil, lit, and ready to shine into the darkness?

How am I leading you to a place where faith is alive within you?

I find it easy to tell people things, voice my opinion, and tell others how God has been speaking to me. But, my relationship with Christ will mean nothing when you meet Christ face to face. That day will not be the time to follow anyone else's faith. Your faith has to be that—your own. Which of the ten virgins do you want to be on the day you meet Christ? What can I do to aid you in your preparation? I know I can't fill your oil lamps—that takes your commitment to your relationship. Your lamps can only be filled with your time sitting at the feet of Jesus. I can give you tools to help you fill your lamps. The tools are yours to use. As you use those tools, your lamps will fill.

The time of preparation is here. How are you preparing?

Application opens up December 1. Applicant must be a member or constituent of Tipton United Methodist Church. All ages and levels beyond high school are encouraged to apply, but graduating high school seniors will be given preference. (\$1,400 – 1 awarded per year)

The second is a Carol Mitchell Ministry Scholarship and is for any member or constituent of Tipton United Methodist Church and must have a degree in Christian Ministry or be attending or planning to attend seminary. (\$2,100 – 1 awarded per year)
